

**Transfer Articulation Agreement
between
State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill
and
Osaka College of Foreign Languages**

JUNE 2010

This document establishes a formal transfer agreement between Osaka College of Foreign Languages and the State University of New York (SUNY Cobleskill).

Objectives of the Agreement

1. To promote the easy transition of qualified students from Osaka College of Foreign Languages to SUNY Cobleskill.
2. To provide a transfer path and specific information to Osaka College of Foreign Languages students who wish to transfer into a degree granting program at SUNY Cobleskill.
3. To attract qualified students to Osaka College of Foreign Languages and SUNY Cobleskill.
4. To exchange information on success and failures of the transfer program in order to improve it.

Terms of the Agreement

1. Students from Osaka College of Foreign Languages must have a minimum 2.25 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all academic work to be eligible to apply.
2. The minimum score required on the paper-based TOEFL exam is 460. The minimum score on the Internet-based TOEFL exam (iBT) is 51. Students whose scores range between 460 and 499 on the paper-based exam or 51 and 60 on the iBT are required to enroll in and successfully complete the SUNY Cobleskill Summer Intensive ESL Program. Students with a paper-based score of 500-510 or iBT score of 61-64 are recommended to enroll in the summer ESL program.
3. Osaka College of Foreign Languages students must complete and file the SUNY Cobleskill International Admissions Application indicating transfer to SUNY Cobleskill with the appropriate nonrefundable application fee by May 1st for fall semester applicants and October 1st for spring applicants. A completed Proof of Financial Ability Statement and official scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) must be included with the application.
4. Courses with grades of C or better will be accepted for transfer credit. Courses with C- or D+ may be accepted for elective credit only.
5. The maximum number of credits that can be transferred to SUNY Cobleskill for an associate degree is 33 and 81 for a baccalaureate degree.
6. Students who do not meet the requirements of this agreement will also be considered for admission. They will be evaluated on an individual basis.

Review and Revision of the Agreement

This joint agreement will be reviewed every three years, or when substantial changes are made in the curriculum on either campus. At the request of either party, a review of the Transfer Articulation Agreement will be conducted by both institutions.

Termination

This agreement shall remain in force from the date on which it is signed until such time as either institution elects to terminate it. Termination by either institution will be announced with sufficient anticipation to assure any students enrolled the opportunity to be admitted to SUNY Cobleskill under its terms.


Effective Date and Signatures


